- 2) All exchange rates use the Operational Rates of Exchange of the United Nations Treasury.
- 3) All figures are represented in USD millions.
- 4) A pledge is a general promise to provide assistance and is usually made for a particular time frame, though not always.
- 5) Committed (or obligated) funds are those for which projects have been approved or agreements/contracts have been signed or are in the process of being transferred or disbursed. Committed funds are exclusive of disbursed funds.
- 6) Disbursement is the transfer of funds from a donor to an implementing partner (which could be governments, non-governmental organizations, UN entities, or private contractor, among others).
- 7) 2010-2012 Cholera Humanitarian Funds: US government Cholera Humanitarian Funds represent disbursements through FY15.
- 8) In line with the Haitian government's desire to integrate cholera prevention and treatment into overall health programming, the US government works extremely closely with the Haitian government, UN and other partners to build long-term solutions to health challenges affecting the nation. The US government's robust health assistance portfolio aims to both improve access to quality health services and strengthen the health system nationwide. US government health programs are further bolstered by sizeable investments to increase access to improved water, sanitation, and hygiene systems. For these reasons, US government funds are captured in the Total under "Disbursed", the US government works closely to coordinate with all partners and align programming with the Haitian government's plans.
- 9) Hurricane Matthew Response Cholera Related Funds: The OCHA flash appeal after Hurricane Matthew included contributions from the following donors: Microsoft (\$39,463); Medicor Foundation (\$240,000); and the UPS Foundation (\$25,000).

\* The US government funds included in this table are the funds that have been committed and disbursed and are not pledges, but they have been included in the Total under "Pledged" (\$207.6 million for Total Cholera Related Funding, \$110.6 million for 2010-2012 Cholera Humanitarian Funds, \$10 million for Hurricane Matthew Response Cholera Related Funds and \$87.1 million for funding outside of the National Plan) to allow the table to accurately reflect all of the donor funds in support of cholera elimination. Of the \$87.1 million for funding outside of the National Plan \$42.3 million has been committed and \$44.8 million has been disbursed.
