(3) Committed (or obligated) funds are those for which projects have been approved or agreements/contracts have been signed or are in the process of being transferred/dispensed. Committed funds are exclusive of dispensed funds.

(4) Disbursed funds are those that have been transferred to an implementing partner (e.g., the Government of Haiti, an NGO or other non-state service provider).

(5) The UN consolidated appeal for Haiti (2011) is coordinated by the Office for Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs. It includes the cholera response and other ongoing humanitarian efforts. The appeal requested \$915.3 million for 2011, of which it had received \$156.0 million by March 31, 2011. \$35.9 million was received from the donors above specifically for the cholera response. The remaining \$120.1 million was received from private funding and other donors from their recovery pledges made at the March 31, 2010 donors conference in New York, or was for non-cholera related activities. Some donors have also contributed to appeal projects through their recovery pledges or other sources of funding. These contributions are not listed above. (7) Funds from the United States government recorded as being committed have been obligated. This means that the funds are guaranteed to the implementing partner which can begin implementation.
