- (1) This brief includes all public sector bilateral and multilateral donors who contributed to the cholera relief efforts. It does not include private sector funding to NGOs. - (2) This analysis is based on data received from ten of the top 12 donors in December 2012. It was converted using UN exchange rates from December 2012.
- (3) Committed (or obligated) funds are those for which projects have been approved or agreements/contracts have been signed or are in the process of being transferred/dispensed. Committed funds are exclusive of dispensed funds.
- (4) Disbursed funds are those that have been transferred to an implementing partner (e.g., the Government of Haiti, an NGO or other non-state service provider).
- (5) The flash appeal is a consolidated appeal for funding coordinated by the Office for Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs. For a full list of donors to the flash appeal see www.reliefweb.org.
- (6) Includes UN agencies, NGO or other contracting agencies.
- (7) Funds from the United States government recorded as being committed have been obligated. This means that the funds are guaranteed to the implementing partner which can begin implementation.
- (8) Brazil, the EC, Korea and the Netherlands have reported funds as being committed. The OSE has made adjustments to the recipients of grants to exclude committed funds. Thus, the recipients of grants for these donors can only be considered estimates.
- (9) The source for OCHA is the Financial Tracking Service (FTS) managed by the Office for Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA). The UK data is based on a combination of data received from the donor and from FTS.
- (10) Canada's financial information for fiscal year 2012-2013 is preliminary.
